SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I hope it is, in boxing, if you are knocked down three times in one round, it is over even if you beat the count. So I hope this is the third knockdown on this bill. Senator Nichol, I have a question I would like to ask you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When you go into a court and they take your license and give you this piece of xerox paper or mimeographed or whatever, suppose the restriction is that you can drive only in your work.

SENATOR NICHOL: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you are an over-the-road driver and you were stopped in Iowa for any purpose and they asked for a driver's license, do you think if you produced a piece of mimeographed paper, it would be accepted to enable you to drive?

SENATOR NICHOL: I don't think it would, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Nichol. Members of the Legislature, I don't think this bill has any merit whatsoever. It gave an opportunity for some issues to be discussed, and now that that has occurred, I think this bill ought to be given the fate it deserves. Rather than offer a kill motion which would delay the process and require additional printing in the Journal, I hope you will simply vote not to advance it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Mr. Clerk, do you want to read the title of the bill first?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 374, read title. There was a public hearing and the bill was advanced to General File. There are no amendments. However, the bill has been considered, it was considered once last year and failed to advance. It was considered on January 9 of this year and has failed to advance.
