Then we have people sitting around in this Legislature talking about people are not working because they don't want to work. Let us remove all discrimination. Then perhaps you can get me to agree with you that there are people who are given the opportunity to work and don't want to accept it but as long as there are impediments established which prevent people from getting this employment I think the state has an obligation to take from its abundance and help these people in the same way that you are helping the Governor put together a war chest for his administration. You are taking from the poor to help the Governor. Well take from some of this abundance and help the poor and as long as I see the Legislature doing what it does, I am going to do what I do.
