SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you yield?

SENATOR HEFNER: If you are against branched banking and multibank holdings...

I also stated for clarification purposes that I do personally support structural change, taking protections in multibank, taking the benefits of certain branching, an honest structural change bill in the state I do support. We do not have that at this time in either bill.

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, another question, Senator DeCamp, I noticed that you voted this bill out of committee...

SENATOR DE CAMP: I not only voted it out of committee, I worked hard to get it out of committee so that it would bring the issue to the floor.

SENATOR HEFNER: Members of the body, with the answer that I just received I would have to oppose killing this bill at this time.
