SENATOR REUTZEL: It is on page 359 of the Journal.

SENATOR VENDITTE: And I didn't read the amendment. I just heard the explanation from Senator Reutzel. To me it seems to be a very reasonable approach.

PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel, do you want to close on your amendment?

SENATOR REUTZEL: Waive closing, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, closing is waived. The motion is the adoption of the Reutzel amendment to LB 436. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? We are voting on the Reutzel amendment to LB 436. Shall we have a Call of the House, Senator Reutzel, and be done with it?

SENATOR REUTZEL: Yes, let's do that.

PRESIDENT: All right. The motion is to have a Call of the House. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will return all members to their desks. All members will return to their desks. All unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. The House is under Call. All members will register their presence. Senator Cope, Senator George, Senator Kelly. Senator Reutzel, do you want us to take call ins while we ...?

SENATOR REUTZEL: Yes, we can try it.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is the adoption of the Reutzel amendment to LB 436. We can take call ins at this time if there is anybody ready to vote.

CLERK: Senator George voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator Pirsch, will you show your presence? Senator Kelly. I think Senator Kelly is in the phone booth. Is he not?

CLERK: Senator Pirsch voting aye.
