Would the Sergeant at Arms see where they are and bring them in or if they are in the hearing of our voice will they please come to the legislative chamber? Senator Clark is here. We need Senator Newell and Senator Wesely. Senator Merz, there is not supposed to be any campaigning. I know what a campaigner you are so... Senator Newell has arrived so now we need Senator Wesely and then we can go. Senator Wesely, if you are in the hearing of my voice we are waiting for you. Here he is. All right, now, Senator Reutzel, are you ready? Roll call vote on the advancement of LB 436. Mr. Clerk, are you ready?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT: Proceed.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on page 424 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. The bill does not advance. Read some matters into the record, Mr. Clerk.
