We have an awfully lot of attractions now in our Sandhill country, in my district, in the Willa Cather area. We have a situation in my own area where we have the most, the biggest migration of waterfowl probably anywhere in the country. Right now the fields are black with ducks who are gleaning the corn from the fields. In a month or so we will have the cranes. We have a lot of things in Nebraska to see that no one has ever heard of and we don't even go to the trouble of telling them. The Game and Parks Commission has spent a little bit of money, quite a bit of money, and they are the only ones that ever put Nebraska on the map. As far as Senator Vickers is concerned, I don't know how he is going to sell his meat if we don't have places to distribute it into the restaurants and the whole business goes with tourism. We spend a lot of money as we tour across the country. Well, I am not going to argue very long. I don't know whether this is a lost cause or not but I still think we are making a big mistake if we don't tax those people that go across our state. I wish I would...if you could make it reciprocal so I wouldn't have to pay in the other states, I would go along with you but it really doesn't make sense. You say well there is only half of our people now that are from out of state. That may well be. I am not sure, and as far as our own truckers and our own traveling people are concerned, they get a reduction in rate now from the motels where they stay on a regular basis so you are not going to hurt them that much and I just can't imagine why we in Nebraska, right in the center of the main thoroughfare across this part of the country, are letting them go through scot-free.
