LR 190, 191

Burrows. (Read LR 190.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: This resolution is for an employee that has spent 44 years of service for the State of Nebraska, and the job the last 25 years as Superintendent of the Beatrice State Developmental Center, a very hard job, a difficult job and a lot of trying times. During this tenure the field of mental retardation has advanced tremendously in the State of Nebraska and I want to send and I hope the Legislature will unanimously send this, well, statement of gratitude and thanks for this long period of service...44 years of service to the state. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion on LR 190? If not, Senator Burrows, that will constitute your opening and close. There is no further discussion, so the question before the House is the adoption of LR 190. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and LR 190 is adopted. We will go then to LR 191, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LR 191 is offered by Senators Sieck, Maresh and Kremer. (Read LR 191.) That resolution, Mr. President, is found on page 407 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Could we have a little better attention. There is a terrible roar that you can hardly hear over the roar that is on the floor, and so before Senator Sieck starts maybe we could just have the roar dulled a bit. Senator Sieck.

SENATOR SIECK: Should I ask for attention?

PRESIDENT: I guess you have to do that.

SENATOR SIECK: On the original bill...on the resolution to provide a chapel at the institution at York we made an error in the wording. I will take the full blame for this error. I should have caught it, but instead of saying "correctional services" we said "correctional institutions", and this could have meant that the institutions, each institution could have provided for these, and I do feel it should be
