The first is offered by Senators DeCamp and Reutzel. I understand that they wish to withdraw this amendment for a time. Is that right, Senator? Senators DeCamp or Reutzel.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well we want to go ahead with the twenty-year old amendment, but which one do you have there? I think we had two versions.

CLERK: I think this is the first version. We had it printed in the Journal. I think this is the one you wanted to withdraw, Senator.

SENATOR DeCAMP: We want to use the grandfather one, just substitute it.

CLERK: Well, I have others ahead. Mr. President, DeCamp-Reutzel amendment, the second version, is found on page 379 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR DeCAMP: We will just take the first one.

CLERK: The first one? Okay, that amendment is on page 122 of the Legislative Journal, Mr. President.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I will be super brief and reserve almost all my remarks for the closing. I supported the Hoagland-Dworak amendment, what, a week or two ago. I suggested to you at that time that you try that on for size, see how it fit, use it for a week or so, see if you liked it. I suggested I was telling you the truth when I told you at that time it had a few more things in it than maybe you understood or might have recognized at that time. I am offering the 20-year old amendment as, I guess, a compromise. I told you I really don't support the bill at all. I think it has gone far enough now. The bill in some form is going to go through, even though I think it could have been stopped originally had we handled it right. We are not there, we are here. I urge you to adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: This is the first DeCamp amendment found on page 122 of the Journal. The Chair recognizes Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I will be brief. The same arguments that were presented on the floor last week in support of 21 for off-sale, 19 for on-sale, still
