SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, the amendment that Senator DeCamp and I are proposing I think strikes a midcourse which we can all live with and I think it cleans up a mess that we have in this bill on Select File. There are a lot of legal questions involved with the set-up as we have in 221 now. The system that we have now we can have some 19-20 year olds grandfathered in and they can purchase on and off-sale. Some other 19-year olds cannot in a year's time. We have created a problem for law enforcement. We have created a real headache for law enforcement under this. Additionally, we are saying to the 19 and 20-year olds that you are responsible enough to go down to the lounge, you are responsible enough to go across town, or to the neighboring town and sit down in a bar and you can watch Monday night football, and you can sit there and drink pitcher after pitcher of beer while you watch that Monday night football game and then you have got to drive home after that experience, but you are not responsible enough to go down to the corner liquor store, pick up a six-pack of beer, take it home and watch that football game at home, off the highways, in the safety of your own apartment or home. I think this amendment clarifies some of the legal problems. I think it is a good midpoint. I think it is something we can all live with. I think it answers the problem of trickle-down, if there is any. I think we should support the amendment and move this bill and let's get on with some other business.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, it is extremely difficult for me to understand the auction which we now have going on like we did with our food tax and a lot of other things. A question of the author of this profound piece of legislation, if he would yield. I am talking about Senator Kelly, not the amendment. Senator Kelly, would you yield to a question? It relates to the amendment.

SENATOR KELLY: I have nothing to yield, but I will answer a question.

SENATOR KOCH: All right. You were insistent that this body adopt 21 as the magic age, were you not? Last year, the year before...right up to this moment.
