PRESIDENT: All right, the motion carries. LB 306 is advanced to E & R for Engrossment, and did somebody move to raise the Call? I didn't...all right. The Call is raised. The Clerk will read some matters into the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have several notices of committee hearings. Committee on Committees gives notice of February 6. Miscellaneous Subjects gives notice of hearing for February 7, 8, 14, 20 and 21. Banking, Commerce and Insurance for Tuesday, February 5. Public Health and Welfare notices of cancellation and resetting of certain bills.

Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined and reviewed LB 221 and recommend that same be replaced on Select File with amendments.

Mr. President, your committee on Revenue whose Chairman is Senator Carsten to whom was referred LB 317 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be indefinitely postponed. (Signed) Senator Carsten, Chairman.

Mr. President, your committee on Judiciary whose Chairman is Senator Nichol to whom was referred LB 621 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File. (Signed) Senator Nichol, Chairman.

Senator Simon makes a motion to raise LB 144 from committee. That will properly be laid over.

Senator Vickers would like to withdraw LB 778. That will properly be laid over.

Mr. President, a new resolution, LR 192. Read. (See pages 473 and 474, Legislative Journal.) That will properly be laid over, Mr. President.
