amendment to LB 483. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The Vickers amendment is adopted. Are there any further amendments? All right, Senator Nichol or Senator Stoney, if you want to make the motion, it is all right. It is a motion to advance. Is there another amendment, Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: On page 449, Mr. President. 449.

PRESIDENT: There is an amendment. Was this amendment pending? Senator Marsh, you may proceed. On page 449 of the Journal.

SENATOR MARSH: Yes, Mr. President, this amendment was requested by parents who have adopted children who were born in countries other than the United States which would allow their foreign born children to have a birth certificate on file in our state when the parents are living here. I have talked with the introducer of LB 483 and he is willing to have this amendment adopted at this place. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Senator Newell, do you wish to speak to this?

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body, this amendment is an amendment that I think is noncontroversial that I am in total agreement with and I would appreciate other members who are supporting the legislation if they would put this amendment on. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Marsh, that will be the closing? Motion before the House is the adoption of the Marsh amendment on LB 483. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The Marsh amendment is adopted. Senator Nichol, do you want to move the bill?

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I move for the advancement of LB 483 to E & R engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Motion to advance LB 483 to E & R for engrossment. Any discussion? All those in favor signify by saying aye.
