SENATOR WESELY: No, I would just add, this is just an attempt to do what I think people would like to see the Legislature do more of and that is if we need laws let's pass them in the correct form and use them appropriately, but if we have laws on the books we no longer need that are no longer necessary, then let's get rid of them. Senator Hoagland has introduced his bill. It is a good step. My feeling is that there is more statutes out there that a process like this would help identify and we could eliminate those statutes and I think the people of the state would be most grateful for that action.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the Wesely amendment to LB 598. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Even the bell has a cold this morning. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion passes. The Wesely amendment is adopted. Any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, do you want to move, Senator Wesely?

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, I move that LB 598 be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: All right, motion to advance LB 598 to E & R for Engrossment. Is there any discussion? All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed nay. LB 598 is advanced to E & R for Engrossment. The Clerk will now read some matters into the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Ag and Environment gives notice of cancellation of public hearing. Your committee on Education gives notice of cancellation and rescheduling of bills for public hearing. (See page 486 of the Legislative Journal.) Your committee on Government, Military and Veterans Affairs gives notice of public hearing for February 8, 14, 21, 22 and 28. (See pages 486 and 487 of the Legislative Journal.) Senator DeCamp would like to have his name withdrawn as co-introducer of LR 30. Senator Nichol would like to print amendments to LB 597 in the Legislative Journal, Mr. President. (See page 487 of the Journal.)
