Senator Powers, Senator Murphy, Senator George, Senator Keyes, Senator Fowler, Senator Schmit, Senator Beutler, Senator Kahle, Senator Sleck, Senator Merz, Senator DeCamp, Senator Goodrich, Senator Fitzgerald, Senator Wagner, Senator Newell, Senator Marsh, Senator Stoney, Senator Clark. Senator Burrows, there are five absent. Senator Kahle, Senator Hefner, Senator Goodrich and Senator Stoney.

SENATOR BURROWS: Go ahead with a roll call vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 495 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 22 nays on adoption of Senator Burrows' amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb now moves to indefinitely postpone LB 465.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I do not believe LB 465 is a good bill. It provides for registration of people for election on election day even though they cannot vote in that election. I fail to see the purpose of the bill because we have several months before
