SPEAKER MARVEL: The vote is on advancement of the bill to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on the advancement of LB 465 to E & R for Review. Have you all voted? Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: I would like a call of the House and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question before the body is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats, record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. How many do we have excused? The Legislature is under Call. Senator Powers, Senator Schmit, Senator Sieck, Senator DeCamp, Senator Barrett, Senator Vickers, Senator Pirsch. Okay, everyone is accounted for. There are five absent. Senator DeCamp. While we are waiting for the roll call vote, I would ask you to turn to your agenda for a moment. This Legislature has charged me with the responsibility of scheduling so that a maximum number of bills could be processed, and I will have next week after working this weekend, have a rather substantial list of bills that most of you would be interested in and will have an impact on the state. So with this in mind you will note that the schedule for Monday is 9:00 a.m. If we continue to meet at 10:00 o'clock Monday morning, we are going to proceed to simply kill Monday and we will have to more rapidly move into night sessions. If you don't want the bills passed, fine. You charge me with the responsibility, I disseminate this information to you, and this is a democratic body, you can do as you see fit but I call it to your attention before we take this final vote in case some of you were to leave. Okay, we are ready for the roll call vote and the vote is on the advancement of LB 465. Is that right?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 496 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.
