SENATOR NICHOL: Okay. Senator Kahle, do you know of any reason why they should not have the meeting later in the month? I am just asking for informational purposes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kahle, do you yield?

SENATOR KAHLE: Sure will. Mr. Speaker and Senator Nichol, the reason, we talked about this in the Education Committee hearing, was the fact that the bills come in at a certain time of the month. We want to have the meeting at a time when the bills are in but we don't want to have the meeting so late in the month that the people that supply the services would not get paid in that particular month and they would perhaps have to extend their credit a whole month which would be unnecessary if we had some sort of stipulation as to when the meeting would be. That was the reason. If you keep shoving it back to the end of the month, why they are going to wait a whole month for their money?

SENATOR NICHOL: I see. There is a waiting period, isn't there, between the time they are approved and the time they can be paid, like ten days or something of this?

SENATOR KAHLE: I think there is a certain...but you could run it clear into the next month.

SENATOR NICHOL: All right, fine, thank you and thank you, Senator Barrett.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kahle, did you have any other comments? Your light was on.

SENATOR KAHLE: No, only that I support the bill as Senator Barrett presented it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the advancement of 735 to E & R for review vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. Bill is advanced. Next bill, LB 700. The Clerk will read.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 700, read title. The bill was read on January 10 of this year. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are no amendments pending, Mr. President.
