SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I move the previous question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question before the House...do I see five seconds? I do. Shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? The motion is to cease debate. Have you all voted? The question before the House is, shall debate cease? Senator Koch. Five excused. Senator Koch. Five are excused.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I would move for a Call of the House.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, to go under Call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please return to your seats, record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The Chair is authorized to... or the Clerk is authorized to receive call-in votes. The motion before the House is, shall debate cease?

CLERK: Senator Merz voting yes. Senator Clark voting... Senator Kahle voting aye. Senator Barrett voting aye. Senator Carsten voting yes. Senator Goodrich voting aye. Senator Fitzgerald voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to cease debate.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. Debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit to close on his motion.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I am concerned because of some of the implications that might have been gathered from Senator Dworak and Senator Murphy's comments. I would like to ask Senator DeCamp to yield to a question. Senator DeCamp, would you yield, please?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes.
