

some of the funds for personal use in order to encourage the individuals to work. Senator Marsh's amendment which she has discussed relates to the problem that might develop between the Department of Administrative Services and the direction of Correctional Services in regard to printing. Both, of course, are under the direction of the Governor. It is not my intention, was not my intention nor do I think it would be the intention of the Governor to allow the Correctional Services to take over those responsibilities that presently are handled by DAS. I wanted to make that clear because otherwise Senator Marsh had proposed an amendment which would place it into law. I really do not think it is necessary to have it in the law. I think that the discretion is there. The director can use it. The Governor can handle it as he sees fit. I think that ought to be sufficient. I do believe, however, that we should adopt Senator Dworak's amendment that provides for personal use of some of the funds. If there are any questions I would be glad to answer them at this time. I have some additional amendments that I will offer if you adopt these.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Marsh, your light is on. Do you wish to speak to the amendment to the amendment? Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker, are we debating the Schmit amendment? You mentioned amendment to the amendment. I thought we were debating Senator Schmit's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Marsh, do you...according to the order, your amendment to 2036 is in order and then Senator Dworak's amendment to 2036. Do you wish to speak to your amendment first?

SENATOR MARSH: Yes. Mr. President, or Mr. Speaker, I have had passed out on all of your desks my amendment to LB 319. I certainly support Senator Schmit in his attempt to clearly delineate that we are encouraging the inmates with eight hours of work. We want to make it possible so that the provisions for their opportunities to work are there. I introduced the amendment to clarify the printing responsibilities within state operations. We already have a print shop with DAS having thousands of dollars invested and highly technical and sophisticated equipment. All of our legislative bills, revenue tax forms, booklets and many other items are printed by DAS. I believe that the state has enough printing requirements to keep both DAS and Corrections with a high volume of work. I also believe that it is important to have DAS responsible for coordinating
