

printing activities. This coordination will avoid duplication of activities and will insure efficiency and economy for all state agencies. I move for the adoption of this amendment to the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now, Senator Dworak, do you want to speak to the Marsh amendment?

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I oppose Senator Marsh's amendment because I think it takes away the flexibility the Governor needs and I have confidence in the Governor in the fact that I don't think he is going to jeopardize that equipment and that delivery system in DAS. I think as Senator Schmit indicated the amendment is not necessary. The amendment is going to preclude any options that the Governor has of shifting one way or the other to or from and I think that is the wrong place to put this type of restriction in statute. I think we have to leave some discretion to our elected Executive and some discretion to our appointed director of Corrections who is appointed by the Executive. I think Senator Marsh's idea is sound and I think it is good but I think it is going to comply. I think it is going to happen. It is happening now and I think it will happen and I personally would like to leave that flexibility with the Governor and with those appointed officials who have control over where the printing is to be done.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit, do you wish to speak to the Marsh amendments?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I agree with what Senator Marsh is attempting to do. I do not think that it is necessary to place it in the statute. I agree with what Senator Dworak stated. I think we should allow the flexibility. As I said earlier, both departments are under the direction of the Governor and certainly he would be able to handle that administratively. I certainly again want to say that I have no objection to Senator Marsh's idea. I think it is sound and it was not my idea or my intention to take away the responsibility of DAS in this printing department, only to provide additional work opportunities for those individuals who are incarcerated and who could be gainfully employed, but I would have to oppose the amendment and hope that maybe Senator Marsh might withdraw it with this assurance from myself.
