

I visited with the director very extensively. I doubt that it would happen but he could do that if he chose to do so and, of course, as I said earlier, would receive the necessary funding from the Appropriations Committee and the Legislature. We are still in control and we are not just going to give him a blank check.

SENATOR WARNER: Would you be terribly upset with an amendment that restricted it to the state owned land, their operation?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well I would be upset, Senator Warner. I don't know if I could do anything about it. You might be able to get it done but I really don't think they are going to expand beyond that. I would like to give it a try the way it is and if it turned out to be troublesome or if they decided they are going to become the largest farm operated around this area which would be pretty large, I think we could perhaps deal with that next year but I would rather not do it this time.

SENATOR WARNER: The other question I have, I am not clear on the procedure on the printing. I thought I understood you to say the Department of Corrections, the director, would determine what they would or would not print. I am talking only for state government. I am not talking about this competitive with local business.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well I think the Governor, DAS and the director would all be involved, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Let me be precise then so that the intent is clear. Section 81-1118 states that the Department of Administrative Services, the Reproduction Bureau which is the print shop shall be responsible for coordinating all existing printing reproduction and mailing operations of the state which shall be limited to existing state facilities. Would I be correct that the bill as it is being proposed now in no way will change the direction that that section as which permits DAS to coordinate printing so it goes to the appropriate place and where the appropriate facilities are to do it?

SENATOR SCHMIT: That is my intention and I am sure that is what Senator Dworak had in mind and certainly...

SENATOR NICHOL: One minute, Senator Warner.

SENATOR SCHMIT: ...you might ask him also but I think that is what we had in mind.
