SENATOR MARSH PRESIDING

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. We are now ready to vote on the indefinite postponement motion on LB 374. It takes 25 votes on Select File. Senator Marsh voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting aye.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Goodrich?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Could you restate the motion that we are voting on? I want to be sure that everybody knows what we are voting on.

SENATOR MARSH: The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB 374. Have you all voted? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I am going to ask for a Call of the House on behalf of the over-the-road truck drivers. It takes 25 votes.

SENATOR MARSH: The Clerk will record. The question is, shall the House go under Call? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Madam Chair.

SENATOR MARSH: The House is under Call. Will every Senator return to his or her seat and indicate your presence, please? Senator, will you accept call in votes? Senator Chambers, will you accept call in votes?

CLERK: Senator Merz voting aye, Senator Cope voting no, Senator George voting aye, Senator Hefner voting aye, Senator Vickers voting aye, Senator Kahle voting aye.

SENATOR MARSH: The Clerk will record. A record vote has been requested.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 6 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

SENATOR MARSH: The motion is postponed. Will you please read the record since a record vote was requested.

CLERK: Oh, I'm sorry.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Venditte requested it.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on pages 565-566 of the Journal.) 27 ayes, 7 nos, on the motion to indefinitely postpone.
