SENATOR WESELY: Well, I don't want to take more time than I think is necessary so I think we ought to have a Call of the House and ask for a roll call vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question before the House is shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 2 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats, unauthorized personnel leave the floor and record your presence. Senator Powers, Senator Murphy, Senator Landis, Senator Warner, Senator Cope, Senator Keyes, Senator Lamb, Senator Kahle, Senator Hefner, Senator Sieck, Senator Merz, Senator DeCamp, Senator Haberman, Senator Goodrich, Senator Hoagland, Senator Chambers, Senator Nichol, Senator Reutzel. The motion before the House is the adoption of the Wesely amendment. Senator Wesely, do you want to take call in votes?

SENATOR WESELY: There seems to be a bit of confusion yet on the motion but I think a roll call vote would be about the best thing we could do at this time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to proceed with the roll?

SENATOR WESELY: Could we go ahead with the roll call vote and have the Clerk read the amendment one more time before we vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will read the Wesely amendment and then we will have a roll call vote.

CLERK: Mr. President, the amendment reads as follows: On page 2, line 25, strike the new matter and reinstate the stricken matter. The amendment is on page 439 of the Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 585, Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Legislature is still under Call.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 13 nays on the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.
