SENATOR NICHOL: That may be true. This doesn't address that at all, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I guess I will reserve judgment on this but I guess I am concerned about the fact that you are expanding a concept of what can be paved without any objection on the part of the people.

SENATOR NICHOL: Yes, what it is doing, some attorneys have felt that cul-de-sacs and dead end streets were something other than a street, and this merely says that cul-de-sacs and dead end streets may be included in a pavement district and are termed to be streets.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 654 to E & R for review as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Do you have items to read in?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Marsh would like to print amendments to LB 483, Senator Haberman to LB 619 and Senator Johnson to LB 730.

Your committee on Judiciary whose Chairman is Senator Nichol to whom we referred LB 749 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File and that is signed by Senator Nichol.
