or these forms to the local fire chiefs, and all he will have to do is sign them and send them in to the State Fire Marshal. I do, perhaps, want to add the emergency clause yet, because this way it would take effect yet this spring, and if we have a dry spring why I think that we certainly need it. Once again, I want to emphasize that the intent of this bill, LB 810, is to give the local fire chief more control and flexibility in his own locality. I move the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, I certainly support the advancement of the bill, but I would hope, Senator, that we would put the emergency clause on it before it advances so it can become effective this spring. So are you putting the emergency clause up there, Senator Hefner? I move we adopt the emergency clause and advance the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to....Senator Keyes made the motion to adopt the emergency clause to LB 810. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Senator Murphy, do you want to talk on the emergency clause? We are voting on the emergency clause for LB 810. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the emergency clause.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The emergency clause is adopted. Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY:Senator Hefner.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR MURPHY: Old neighboring Senator, I concur with the thrust of your bill, but I would raise a question as to a copy of the report being sent to the Fire Marshal. We do not say that it shall be sent in a manner which would...in which it would arrive at his office prior to the burning, and inasmuch as it does not arrive prior there is not a lot he can do about it, and I wonder if we could eliminate... either make it mandatory that that notice arrive in his office and he approve it before the burning or else just eliminate forwarding a piece of paper that is going to wind up in file 13 anyhow and has absolutely no impact if it doesn't arrive before that time. Could we not just file the permit locally?
