CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. If you will take your yellow work sheet, in the second category which includes bills advanced to General File with no dissenting votes, and with committee amendments attached, we will pass over 628 and we covered 602, 645 and 654 yesterday. So this will bring us down to LB 621.

CLERK: Can I read something real quickly?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, go ahead.

CLERK: Mr. President, before that, your committee on Revenue whose Chairman is Senator Carsten to whom was referred LB 913 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File with amendments. (Signed) Senator Carsten. (See page 608 of the Legislative Journal.) Your committee on Public Health and Welfare whose Chairman is Senator Cullan to whom was referred LB 932 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File; 951 General File; 958 General File with amendments; and 728 indefinitely postponed. (Signed) Senator Cullan. (See page 608 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, new bill, 701A, introduced by Senator Kremer. (Read by title for the first time LB 701A as found on page 609 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President. LB 621 was introduced by the Judiciary Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read title to LB 621.) The bill was read on January 9 of this year. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee for public hearing. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Nichol's Judiciary Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Before we go to the next bill, underneath the north balcony Miss Marlene Napier from North Platte, Nebraska. She may have left. Is she there? Okay.

LB 621. Senator Nichol, do you want to move the adoption of the committee amendments?
