SENATOR GEORGE: Because they are not listening.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor of placing the House under Call vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. Do you want to accept call-in votes, Senator George?

SENATOR GEORGE: Yes.

CLERK: Senator Sieck voting aye. Senator Reutzel voting aye. Senator Nichol voting aye. Senator Murphy still voting no. Senator Dworak voting no. Senator Warner voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The committee amendments are adopted. Now Senator George, do you want to explain the bill?

SENATOR GEORGE: Yes, Mr. President, the bill already has been properly explained. The only thing left in there is the actual intent of the bill to remove the eight percent interest restriction. I move the advancement of LB 703 to E & R Initial.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 703 to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the advancement of LB 703 to E & R for Review, as amended. The motion is the advancement of the bill. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, very quickly, your committee on Retirement Systems whose Chairman is Senator Fowler to whom was referred LB 230 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File. (Signed) Senator Fowler.
