it. It is the same chapter and everything. The committee amendment only deals with one section but it is the same chapter. I don't see any problem, I guess. We have done it all the time here.

SENATOR HEFNER: I object to the amendment to the committee amendment, Mr. Chairman. I would like to have your ruling on it.

SENATOR NICHOL: For the time being I will overrule you, Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Please?

SENATOR NICHOL: At this time I will overrule you. Now you may challenge the Chair, if you like. I would suggest you visit with Senator DeCamp there for a minute and see if you can work it out. In the meantime, Senator Keyes, would you like to speak to the DeCamp amendment?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes. The DeCamp amendment makes this bill one of the most important bills that this Legislature will have before it this year. On a Friday forenoon, a fifteen minute allocation of time, I move that we pass over the bill. If I see no opposition, I will presume that we will pass over the bill.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay, we will vote on that, Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR NICHOL: Is there any objection to passing over it? Seeing none, we will pass it over.

SENATOR DWORAK: We are passing over the whole bill? The amendment has not been adopted. The committee amendments have not been adopted. Thank you.
