SENATOR VENDITTE: Sell the property?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes. Is that right, Senator Kahle?

SENATOR VENDITTE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Thank you, Senator.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is to advance 914 to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. The motion is the advancement of the bill. Have you all voted on the advancement of the bill? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill, LB 723.

CLERK: LB 723 was introduced by the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee. (Read title to LB 723.) The bill was read on January 11 of this year. It was referred to the Constitutional Committee for public hearing. I have committee amendments by Senator Reutzel's Constitutional and Revision Committee pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I move the adoption of the committee amendments. They are in part technical and the only substantive change in the amendments is the effective date to January 1, 1981. I move their adoption.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments to 723, as explained by Senator Reutzel. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 723. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? I think we are going to have to put the House under Call and keep the House under Call unless we can figure out some method of you indicating your presence. We have got about four or five more bills that we need at least to confront this morning. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: I move the advancement of the bill. 723 was brought to us by the Game and Parks Commission in response to information they received from the Corps of Engineers primarily. 723 would equalize the resident and
