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to vote on the Warner amendment and then that will end this particular debate on this bill and it will have to come up at a subsequent time. So the motion at the moment is the adoption of the Warner amendment to the committee amendments, is that right? Okay, all those in favor of the Warner amendment to the committee amendment vote aye, opposed vote no.

SENATOR DeCAMP: A Call of the House and a roll call vote. This takes a simple majority so I want a Call of the House and a roll call vote. Otherwise it is going to pass with sixteen votes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? The question before the House is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor of placing the House under Call vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 2 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats, unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Roll call vote. The vote is the adoption of the Warner amendment to the committee amendment. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, could I ask for a clarification on the amendment?

SPEAKER MARVEL: On the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Could I ask for a clarification, Mr. President?

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will read the amendment you are voting on. It is too complicated to answer in just a sentence or two.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Could Senator Warner answer the question?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, the Chair will allow you time to briefly explain what your amendment does.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I have still not got a copy of Senator DeCamp's amendment. I looked at it. As I understand it, the amendment I offered only affected state employees. It would not affect the balance of the committee amendment, if I read your amendment right, John. So it would put that at eighteen and a half cents and leaves untouched the balance of the committee amendment. It would still remain twenty-one

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
