our young people and I certainly don't think that we should vote today without recognizing the situation we are in. I am going to ask that my amendment be withdrawn. I have taken up my three minutes and that is all I wanted to say. I feel better for it. It is a point that needed to be made and I appreciate your attention. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: It is the prerogative of the introducer to withdraw the amendment so the amendment is withdrawn. Yes. Okay, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Do we have an opportunity to address the amendment?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No. No, sir. When he withdraws, that is it. The Clerk will read LB 221 on Final Reading.

CLERK: (Read LB 221 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All legislators must be in their seats on Final Reading. Okay.

CLERK: (Continued to read LB 221 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record found on pages 645-646 of the Journal.) 31 ayes, 13 nays, 4 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed. The next bill is LB 306.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first motion is offered by Senator Hoagland. Senator Hoagland moves to return LB 306 to Select File for a specific amendment and that amendment is found on page 572.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would like to withdraw that amendment, Mr. Speaker, if I may.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Senator Hoagland withdraws his amendment. Do you have another one?
