SENATOR LEWIS: The Clerk is not involved in this issue. You have had your time to explain it. Now the Chair will explain the position that I understand and that is based on a little longer experience that when we take a particular item from Final Reading and put it on Select File, we consider it on Select File. Now, there is no other point of order before the House. The question is, shall the Chair be overruled. Those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. You do not have a point.

SENATOR BEUTLER: (mike not activated.) ...Speaker, without asking me what my point is.

SENATOR LEWIS: The question before the House is shall the Chair be overruled. The participants in this particular issue would be Senator Landis and the Speaker. Record your vote. The question is, shall the Chair be overruled.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Is the motion not a debateable motion, Mr. Speaker?

SENATOR LEWIS: That is correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: That is your ruling?

SENATOR LEWIS: That is correct. All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed vote no.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I move to adjourn.

SENATOR LEWIS: The Chair didn't recognize him anyway. All those in favor will vote aye and overrule the Chair...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, a motion to adjourn takes precedence...

SENATOR LEWIS: ...those opposed will vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 14 nays on the motion to overrule the Chair, Mr. President.

SENATOR LEWIS: The motion fails. Read the next bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...(mike not activated.) ...Legislature is going to take this and let him be out of order like that, I am going to be out of order. It is one thing for us to have a
