SENATOR WESELY: And then this new development with the federal funds says if we pick up the 10% the feds will come out of their pocket and there won't be any increase in state dollars. This is a new development. Isn't it?

SENATOR LAMB: That is correct.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler, then Senator Haberman and then Senator DeCamp and then Senator Warner. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I think, Mr. Speaker, that Senator Wesely asked my question, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I rise to support Senator Lamb as in the fiscal note it says, "the impact on local school districts would be a direct dollar for dollar saving." It states that the Department of Education will get extra federal funds and that it indeed will lower the local property tax so I rise to support Senator Lamb on his amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. Debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Lamb to close on his motion.

SENATOR LAMB: I move that the bill be advanced, Mr. Chairman.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the advancement of 765 to E & R for review vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill, LB 748, Senator Wagner.
