SENATOR SCHMIT: No, it does not change the brand area at all.

SENATOR CLARK: It leaves the brand areas as they are?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, it does.

SENATOR CLARK: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, I just rise to support Senator Schmit in LB 797. I have visited with Senator Schmit about it and read it over a little bit and it certainly seems logical to me and I would also agree with the statement that he made, I wish it was perhaps expanding the brand area somewhat but this is a good attempt it seems to me at clarifying some of the things. I would urge the body's support of LB 797.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I am curious, Senator Schmit, there is, I notice by the fiscal note supposedly no change and yet you have stricken the previous proposition that they would receive \$5.00 a day for not more than five days and they are now going to be paid per diem and necessary expense for travel without any apparent limitation and I wonder if that fiscal note is correct?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I don't notice the fiscal note. The brand division is a self-supporting division supported by fees collected from the livestock producer, Senator Murphy. That is all the information I have on it.

SENATOR MURPHY: Well that's a real good approach to funding, Senator Schmit, and I compliment you on that.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 797 to E & R for review. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed no. We are voting to advance the bill to E & R for review. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Next bill, Mr. Clerk, 764.

CLERK: (Read title.) The bill was read on January 15. It was referred to the Education Committee for public hearing and advanced to General File. There are no amendments, Mr. President.
