Mr. President, LR 199 is ready for your signature.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of doing business, I propose to sign and I do sign LR 199.

CLERK: Mr. President, finally I have a report from the Buildings and Grounds Division pursuant to statute. That will be on file in my office. (See page 713 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Okay, ready then, Mr. Clerk, for....all right, Mr. Clerk, Senator Keyes has a motion that the Speaker said is all right to put ahead of agenda item 5 since we will wait for a few more people to show up before we take up agenda item 5, so proceed with Senator Keyes' motion.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, this shouldn't take more than 25 votes. We had a bill given to us earlier this year. It is LB 948. It has to do with the road construction people out of Omaha. They have got the problem solved. They want the bill killed, the hearing killed, and everything, and I suggest we suspend the right rule and take it up at this time.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion on Senator Keyes' motion? This is a motion to cancel the hearing and....or to withdraw the bill, but first we have to suspend the rules to do either or both today, so...

SENATOR KEYES: I think we should suspend the right rule.

PRESIDENT: We have to suspend the right rules to do both today so the question is really one on suspension to do these things. Any further discussion? All right, all those in favor of suspending the rules vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the rules.
