SENATOR MURPHY: And I am relating to strictly educational pensions. Let me ask you this, Senator Fowler. What is the Appropriations Committee appropriation this year to fund that liability? \$3,000,000, \$4,000,000, \$5,000,000?

SENATOR FOWLER: It is around 4 to 5 million is the request for the teachers' retirement from the actuary.

SENATOR MURPHY: 4 to 5 million?

SENATOR FOWLER: Right. So this would add \$350,000 to that annual appropriation.

SENATOR MURPHY: Which will continue for any number of years, so the total liability is far in excess of that, and I am just wondering which of these people who are signing petitions and asking for lids, which of those people are we going to take this money from? Somewhere the cost of government is going up. Somewhere we are going to take more money from somebody. Who are we going to take it from, Senator?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy, your time is up.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you, I think I have finished.
