PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on LR 201? If not, I guess, Senator DeCamp, that is your opening and your closing on this resolution. All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The Legislative Resolution 201 is adopted. Anything further on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Miscellaneous Subjects whose Chairman is Senator Newell to whom we referred LB 939 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File with amendments.

Mr. President, Senator Kremer would like to print amendments to LB 507 in the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: We are ready then for Final Reading. The Sergeant at Arms will clear the aisles. All nonlegislators will leave the floor. All legislators will go to their desks and get ready for Final Reading. We are on Final Reading. We have a considerable number of bills this morning so it would be nice if everybody would get here so we could get started. Would all nonlegislators leave the floor, all legislators get to their desk so that we can commence Final Reading. We are on Final Reading or will be soon I hope. Okay, we are ready now. Proceed with Final Reading, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell asks unanimous consent to take up LB 483 after LB 658 on Final Reading. Senator Newell asks unanimous consent to take up LB 483, which is the first bill on Final this morning, take it up after LB 658.

PRESIDENT: No objections to...that is after what number?

CLERK: LB 658.

PRESIDENT: ...after 658, all right. Any objections? The Speaker doesn't object so we will go ahead. We will proceed then with LB 599.
