LB 499, 499A

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate ceases. Senator Wesely, do you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR WESELY: Very briefly. The amendment would just strike the county option allowing the counties to impose a 2% lodging tax at their discretion and would leave in a 1% state sales tax administered at the state level for state tourism promotion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You are voting on the Wesely amendment to LB 499. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the Wesely amendment to LB 499. Have you all voted? The issue before the House is the Wesely amendment. Senator Wesely. Okay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion fails. The amendment is not adopted. Senator DeCamp, what will we do with the bill?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, there is a lot of things but I suppose we ought to advance it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House is the advancement of LB 499. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the advancement of LB 499. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 12 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carries. The bill is advanced. The next bill is 499A. Are we ready to advance that bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp. The motion is the advancement of 499A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the A bill to go along with 499 which you approved a few minutes ago. Have you all voted? The motion before the House is 499A. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Senator Wesely, are you there? Do we have E & R amendments?
