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SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Marsh, I wasn't really trying to embarrass you because I don't know either and I just thought perhaps you might...but my point is, if these vehicles are used...

SENATOR MARSH: There aren't very many of the vehicles either.

SENATOR NICHOL: Well it doesn't make any difference how many there are. If they are not legitimate they shouldn't be granted special permission, but my point is, Senator Marsh, if these vehicles have to be used by persons and those persons are doing something. Now I really don't know if they train people every day to go out and search for planes or if these people use these cars to take the trainees to the airplane or back home or go pick them up. I just don't know the use of these vehicles and I would like to know....

SENATOR MARSH: Senator, I have someone who can answer some questions for you. Thank you.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Having been in the Civil Air Patrol I think I can help you, Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Fine. Please.

SENATOR HABERMAN: They take youngsters. They teach them how to march. They teach them how to drill. It is something like ROTC. The government gives them surplus airplanes. Some of them learn how to fly. The CAP goes on search missions when somebody is down. They use these vehicles to transport people in these search missions. They have practice search missions that they take the station wagons with the radio equipment and go out in the area and try to find a mock aircraft that is down and it is sort of like I say, the ROTC. Basically they are used on weekends and it is a lot of young people in high school basically are in the Civil Air Patrol and I am sure this is what they are used for.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Haberman, I appreciate that. Now let me ask you one other question, Senator Haberman. Where are these vehicles kept when they are not being used? Are they taken home by personnel or are they housed at the Civil Air Patrol quarters, whatever that might be or what?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I can't answer that but I would guess they
