SENATOR MARSH: It is my understanding, Senator Newell, that these are owned and used only for purposes of the Civil Air Patrol. They are not private vehicles.

SENATOR NEWELL: Are they used by individuals...?

SENATOR MARSH: I have been assured and I will check again, that these are used only for that purpose but I have it in writing that it is only for Civil Air Patrol purposes and not for private usage in any manner.

SENATOR NEWELL: One other question, then I have one other question and I would like to ask the question to, well, Senator Lewis is not here, Senator DeCamp. Is Senator DeCamp here? Senator DeCamp? Well let me ask this general question. I see this as an exemption and I don't really understand and I am worried about it being an exemption and I don't really understand why it went to the Public Works Committee in terms of that. I think exemptions should be routed through or clarifications for exemptions should be routed through the Revenue Committee and this tendency is very distressing to me. The last two, the big A bill came out of Public Works. This one came out of Public Works and that bothers me and I don't know...

SENATOR MARSH: Senator, I did not request that it go any specific where, that was just where I was told it had been assigned so I do not serve on the committee which...

SENATOR NEWELL: I understand. Senator DeCamp is here now and he is the one I kind of wanted to ask this question to. Senator DeCamp, 604 has been, was referred, it deals with the exemptions. Are you familiar with 604, Senator DeCamp? Well as the vice chairman of the Reference Committee I was wondering about 604. It seems to deal with exemptions and it was routed through the Public Works Committee and that along with the big A and then the big A exemption the other day is routed through the Public Works Committee and I have kind of always thought exemptions and tax issues ought to be routed through the Revenue Committee. Can you explain why this was referred in the way it was?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Sure. Okay, how many bills do we have this year? I mean total, about eleven hundred, nine hundred, I don't know and this is going to surprise you. I remember exactly the reason why each one was referred to every committee and this one was referred there because somebody said that is where it should go. I think that person was Krepel and unless anybody had dissenting reasons. I didn't have any dissenting reason. I don't
