SENATOR STONEY: I would like to read the language of the first amendment that was offered and the second also.

SPEAKER MARVEL: This will not take time off from this particular issue. The Chair could rule that you have waived but we will proceed with reading it. Yes. What page is it on?

CLERK: Mr. President, the amendment is found on page 613 of the Journal and it reads as follows: "On page 3 in lines 21 and 24 reinstate 65 and strike 70."

SPEAKER MARVEL: Just a moment. Senator Stoney, did you find it?

CLERK: Page 613, Senator.

SENATOR STONEY: Yes.

CLERK: The amendment that we have just adopted reads as follows: (Read Koch amendment found on page 815 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I move that LB 733 be advanced as amended.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance the bill to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. The motion is the advancement of the bill. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 6 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried and the bill is advanced. The next bill is LB 773.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 773 was introduced by the Education Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 15, delivered to the Education Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Koch's Education Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, LB 773 came about because of committee actions on some hearing as it relates to special education. In 1973 this body saw fit
