LB 823, 666

SENATOR NEWELL: Let me just explain, this bill regulates the private security industry. Basically the amendments that we put on are amendments that the industry felt secure with. The bill was originally written was different from the bill that was written last year so we put it back in the same form it was last year. Basically it exempts police officers, it provides for finger printing, it sets up uniform standards and sets up a regulatory process for private security people. With that in mind I urge that the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of LB 823 to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on the advancement of the bill. Have you all voted? The motion is the advancement of 823 to E & R for review. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...see if I can either move it or not, then I will let it be.

SPEAKER MARVEL: A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of placing the House under Call vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the House is under Call. All Legislators please take their seats and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Have you all voted? Have you all recorded your presence? Excuse me. Call ins are... The Clerk is authorized to take call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Hoagland voting aye, Senator Landis voting aye, Senator Vickers voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, announce the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill is LB 660.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 660 was introduced by Senator Cope.

SPEAKER MARVEL: ...just pass over. The introducer is not present. 666.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 666 was introduced by Senator
