somewhere else solely. It is a dual filing for those accounts that would be in the office of the Secretary of State.

SENATOR KAHLE: And I see there is an A bill with it.

SENATOR MURPHY: The fiscal staff indicated, then talked to me this morning about that there will not be a fiscal impact until after next year. The effective date of the bill, the date of transfer, indicate that until September 1 of next year there will not be a fiscal impact so you will have next year in which to consider that.

SENATOR KAHLE: But there will be one eventually?

SENATOR MURPHY: Ultimately there will be a shift of this process from the Public Service Commission to the Secretary of State and I don't know that there will be any more of an impact than there presently is. It would, I think, be more of a transfer of impact.

SENATOR KAHLE: You don't have any idea how many employees are involved in this?

SENATOR MURPHY: I do not.

SENATOR KAHLE: I'm not sure that this is the same bill that I have gotten some calls on but it sounds like it and I think it is going to cost considerable more than that when we get through and I am not sure the records are going to be as available as they are now. So until I find more about it I would have to vote against it.

SENATOR MURPHY: Well I cannot speak to whatever the people who called you were thinking about because I don't know what that is but if this process is presently in place in the office of the Public Service Commission, I can hardly believe that putting it in place in the office of the Secretary of State will have much more of an impact other than the possibility of the data processing procedure. It will be new and I would think ultimately, lower the cost if anything but then like I say, I don't know what these people who are talking to you are talking about, Senator.
