SENATOR KEYES: Taxwise you cannot incorporate for the preceeding year. You can incorporate for the year in which you incorporate or the pursuing years. So the emergency clause means nothing. Let's just get it on there.

SENATOR JOHNSON: And in addition, I should tell you, Senator Keyes, most corporations adopt a different tax year than individuals do.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the emergency clause to the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the emergency clause for LB 893. CLERK: 10 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to go under Call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats, record your presence. The Chair meanwhile is authorized to take call in votes. Record your presence.

CLERK: Senator Murphy, you had voted aye, Senator; Senator Warner had voted aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Has everyone recorded their presence? The Clerk is authorized to take call in votes if anybody is so inclined.

CLERK: Senator Sieck, you had voted aye, Senator. Senator Cope voting aye.
