

departments the authority and the tools which they feel they need to accomplish a task, and I think that Mr. Harrington has been most honest and sincere in trying to deal with this whole question of valuation. It is a very difficult question, one this Legislature has dealt with numerous times, but really the real problem was always the enforcement. We could never get the proper enforcement in each of the 93 counties in this state. So I think it is our responsibility to give Mr. Harrington the tools that he needs to accomplish this task, and if he does not accomplish this task and he does not administratively put the pressure on those counties and so forth to do this every two years, then it will be his fault and then it will be clear where the responsibility lies. But if this Legislature does not allow him those tools, then it will be partially our fault. We will be opting and giving the opportunity for counties to pretend that they are doing a yearly re-evaluation when, in fact, they will not be doing that. So with that in mind, those two factors, the practicality of it all, I think this is a good bill. It does not deserve to be killed. The administration at least needs some time to try to work through these problems. I am willing to give it to the administration. If they fail in their efforts then it will be their fault and I think we then must act again as we did in the past. But we have to vest them with at least the tools to accomplish the task. Thank you.
