SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, roll call....all legislators please take your seats so we can proceed with the roll call vote. Call the roll. We are voting on the Fowler amendment to LB 765. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on page 870 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adopt.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Any other amendments on 765?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner moves to amend the bill by striking "1980" and inserting "1979" in section 1, lines 5 and line 4.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, this is corrective. As the bill was drafted it has an effective date of September, 1980 and the purpose of the emergency clause in part was to make it permissible to utilize these funds for the ten percent counties match '79-'80 school year. Unless that effective date is adjusted in line 5 back to 1979 we can't use the funds this year and we lose the advantage of reducing the ten percent match and also had a problem of maintenance of effort, so this is a technical change to be consistent with what the purpose of Senator Lamb's original amendment with the emergency clause was. I move its adoption. I should add it will add a federal fund appropriation in the amount something less than for next year. I don't know the exact
