SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, it provides, though, for the new methods under the Department of Agriculture rules and regulations and provides for a different method of identifying those animals that are stricken with bangs, and it is accepted by the Department of Agriculture and it is their recommendation.

SENATOR KREMER: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Question of Senator Schmit, please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit, do you yield?

SENATOR LAMB: Would this...if you have waste products from packing plants which comes from the ruminant of cattle, which is primarily corn, would this amendment prohibit the feeding of this material to cattle?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Except for subsection 4, Senator Lamb, which would allow the Department of Agriculture under special conditions to exempt that material from the provisions of the bill. Under subsection 4 the Department of Agriculture could allow that if they so chose.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any other discussion? Okay, Senator Schmit, do you wish to close?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I have no closing, Mr. President. I move the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the amendments as explained by Senator Schmit to LB 631. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Voting on the adoption of the Schmit amendments to 631. Have you all voted? Do you wish to adopt the amendments as presented by Senator Schmit to LB 631? If so, please vote aye. If not, vote no. Senator Schmit. The Chair fails to get a majority.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I ask the members to please vote to avoid....

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Schmit's amendment.
