We took out the language that you have to have reason for recall, like drunkenness and such words as that which were hard to prove, and I hope you will support this LB 601 and the statutes will be the same for the cities as they are for the counties that make it fair to those that are trying to recall someone and also those that are in office. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the advancement of 601 to E & R for Engrossment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Say aye....all those in favor say aye, sorry. All those opposed no. The motion carried. The bill is advanced. Have you got something to read up there? Yes, 913. Where is Senator Nichol?

CLERK: Mr. President, 913, Senator Burrows had amendment... there are E & R amendments first of all, I should say.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 913.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill.
