with the responsibility of processing four hundred bills. I also would suggest too that the only way that we can meet that deadline is to do one of two things, and that is either meet longer days or extend the session. I suggest you think about those two alternatives as we proceed with Final Reading and as this Chair continues to assume the cranky schoolmaster approach to discipline. If you don't wish discipline, then we are going to do one of two things. If we are going to process anywhere near those four hundred bills, we are either going to do it by extended sessions, by extending the session or by disciplining ourselves and limiting to the best of our ability debate. Some of you are listening now, some of you aren't. Will the Clerk read LB 496 on Final Reading.

CLERK: Final reading of LB 496.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I would ask for a Call of the House.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, let the bill fail. I was supposed to tell you this morning the Banking Department says the bill is okay now. They reached an agreement on it but I forgot to tell.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. The Clerk will record the vote.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: A roll call vote. Okay. All legislators would please take their seats. And legislators also will please cooperate with the rules with regard to legislation. We will proceed with the roll call as soon as everybody is in their seat. Okay, call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 889, Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, Senator DeCamp changing from yes to no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: (Mike Off) Your light is on. For what purpose do you arise? Okay.
