not worry because the Legislature will simply lift out other portions of the bill, put it in another bill and this way he has not only a veto right on the legislation he destroyed, but prior censorship. I think it is a poor legislative practice and I think that particular proposal that Senator Marsh is asking for should be either introduced as a special bill with thirty votes this session or it ought to come in next session. I do not think it ought to be added as an amendment to LB 681 and I will oppose the motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the return of 681 for a specific amendment. Senator Marsh, do you wish to close on your...okay, the motion before the House is the return of 681 for the specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 4 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is returned. Senator Marsh, do you want to make your motion?

SENATOR MARSH: I move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of adopting the amendment as proposed by Senator Marsh vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 2 nays on the motion to adopt the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried and the amendment is adopted. Senator Marsh. All those in favor of returning the bill to E & R for engrossment. Excuse me, Senator Keyes, your light is on first.

SENATOR KEYES: All I want to know, is it possible to let the bill set on E & R for ten days to find out what is really going on in this bill?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No.

SENATOR KEYES: Oh, I think we can leave it set on General File.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill will be reprinted with amendments on before it is brought up on Final Reading again, Senator.
