LB 790A

Legislature. Senator Clark, since you are the Chairman of Intergovernmental Affairs, if you will come up here I will give you the list of names and the list of the positions. You just go back....you can kind of be the intermediary, okay? Now I would call to the attention of the Legislature before we proceed that we have two sections of the agenda today. The first is General File and the second is Select File. The Select File items are those which have only E & R amendments. The General File category, if you follow the worksheet, you will find that there are half a dozen bills that are on the worksheet that are not on the General File category, and those that are not on General File today have been set up in a special category and the Clerk will have it in the Journal before the day is over. So if you are seeking bills that you can't find, you check with the Clerk and very shortly there will be a letter that will place these bills in a special category for discussion next week. Now, Mr. Clerk, I think we are ready for General File and the first bill is LB 790A.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 790A was introduced by Senator DeCamp. (Read title to LB 790A.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: This is just the A bill on the other bill that is, I guess it is on Select. Is that right? I move it be advanced.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 790A. Senator Keyes, your light is on.

SENATOR KEYES: Just a question of Senator Warner.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, will you yield?

SENATOR KEYES: This is \$44,000 from the General Fund and \$7000 from the Cash Fund. Will this be included in the seven percent that we are going to try to stay under, or is this above and beyond that?

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Keyes, I don't believe the....I don't know that the Legislature as a whole has voted. I don't believe they have, to have a seven percent limitation on increase in receipts that could be expended. What has happened that I can tell you is that as far as the Appropriations Committee is concerned, we are as we always do allocating approximately one percent of the total appropriation for A bills....to be available for A bills amendments

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
