SENATOR KEYES: Well, Senator Warner, wouldn't it seem odd that when you are going to cut down on the number of employees that you have and transfer the responsibility to the Department of Agriculture, that to get rid of it it would take \$32,500? I would think if you were going to...

SENATOR WARNER: No, now, Senator Keyes, we are transferring money from Revenue to the Department of Agriculture but we are transferring less than the program previously was costing. But you have to run an appropriation bill to move money from one agency to another agency even though there is no additional expenditure.

SENATOR KEYES: Then we are going to save money, I hope.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 834A to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on the advancement of 834A to E & R for Review. Record.
